

California Cannabis-Associated Emergency Room Visits Are Skyrocketing

A California Emergency:

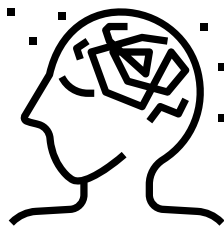
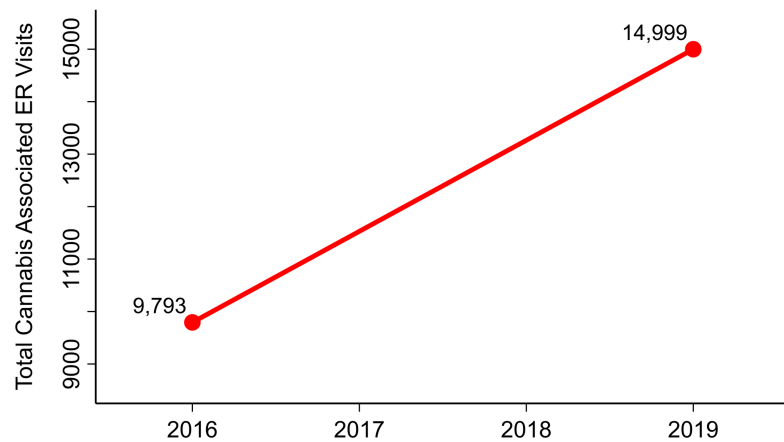
- CA Emergency room visits for cannabis associated psychosis/delirium or perceptual disturbances rose 54% between 2016 and 2019.
- CA Emergency room visits with a cannabis related diagnoses as the primary cause of the visit increased ten-fold since 2005 and by 53% from 9,793 in 2016 to 14,999 in 2019.
- CA Emergency room visits with a cannabis related diagnosis increased 19% from 125,546 in 2016 to 149,145 in 2019.
